<sup>\*</sup>There was some discussion about the "Chinese" Goose, which appears in one field guide and is what we saw, however, it is a domestic breed, clearly with a lot of Graylag Goose in its ancestry! There was also at least one Muscovy and several Mallard cross-breeds, which is not unusual. The Canvasback male posed nicely next to a Redhead male, illustrating the salient field marks, most notably, the definitive slant in its forehead and bill.
